He Lives in You

Disney re-released my favourite film of all time in July. If you haven't yet been to see Disney's live action remake of The Lion King, I thoroughly recommend it. Since I first saw it, in the original animation, to the West End stage version and now this remake, the story never fails to inspire and encourage me.

Simba, at an early age, is shown his potential and gets excited about the vocation he will one day inherit as King. Simba then has his future brutally taken from him by his uncle out of his own selfish desire to rule. Simba is told that the evil present is his fault.

It's only after a time of forgetting and re-learning that Simba realises he doesn't have to let his past govern his future. Rafiki, the wise old monkey, says "Oh yes, the past can hurt. But from the way I see it, you can either run from it, or learn from it." For all of us, we can allow the past to hold us down, keep us back and stop us from being who God created us to be and

doing what God has called us to do.

The story of the Lion King retells in a wonderful way the power that sin has over us but also the beauty of the power of God to restore, renew and repurpose all of us no matter how badly things have gone wrong.

Through the cross of Christ, that act of brutal punishment over 2000 years ago, God intervenes in all our lives and does 2 remarkable things.

First, he takes the evil, brokenness and pain in and around our lives and says 'This is no longer yours, I forgive you, I heal you, I love you' Secondly, he chooses not to be a distant God, a king separated from his subjects, but he chooses to come and live within us. The power and presence of God lives within each one of us, to inspire us daily in the purposes that God has laid upon our lives but also so that wherever we may go, however far we may feel we have fallen from God at times, he is still there.

Mufasa to Simba puts it this way;

'Simba you have forgotten me. You have forgotten who you are and so forgotten me. Look inside yourself Simba, you are more than what you have become, you must take your place in the circle of life. Remember who you are...remember'

The Apostle Paul writes in his letter to Ephesians 'I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.' (Ephesians 3:16-19)

Remember God lives in you, you have the same power that defeated evil living in you, and with him you can make a difference to the world and people around you.

Newala News

George Mbesigwe visited us in July 2018 and has been one of our main contacts in the Diocese of Newala. Immediately after his return to Tanzania George was promoted and given a new posting in the Ministry of Education. We thought it would be interesting to quiz George a year later about how things were working out in his new role.

What is your new job, and what responsibilities do you have? I am now the District Primary Education Officer for Manyoni District in Singida Region. Previously, I was an Education Officer responsible for school budgeting and inspecting schools in Tunduru District much, much nearer Newala. Now I am the district representative of the Ministry in all matters

of primary education (and pre-primary), supervising the implementation of government policy, seeking to develop primary education provision and quality, overseeing, appraising and supporting all primary teachers (70 head teachers and nearly 700 teachers) as well as support staff, and, of course, managing and monitoring budgets. I'm also responsible for adult education. It's a big job!

Where are you based now?

Manyoni Town is the capital of Manyoni District which is in Singida Region right in the centre of Tanzania to the west of Dodoma(Tanzania's inland political capital) and Dar Es Salaam on the coast. Manyoni is 1,267 kilometres from Mtwara and covers over 14,000 square kilometres, more than a quarter of Singida Region. Half the District is designated Game Reserves (Runwa, Muhesi and Kizigo), only about 850km² is arable land, double that for animal grazing and nearly 4000km² is forest. Manyoni is also the headquarters of the Anglican Diocese of the Rift Valley. When I arrived here the Bishop made me an Elder of a Cathedral Parish.

What's happening to your family now you are working so far away from home in Mtwara? My wife, Godliver, is still at Mtwara and will stay there for a time until I find a possibility for her to join me here. Godliver is a teacher in Majengo Parish Kindergarden (a RC Parish), and also runs a small cater-

ing business, supplying food to seminars, weddings ceremonies and the like. Beatrice, our eldest daughter (19), is at boarding school doing what you call A levels in Chemistry, Biology and Geography. She will transfer to Maria de Mattais High School in Dodoma this month as it is only

126kms from Manyoni. Her ambition is to become a doctor.

Switbert (16) is also at boarding school, run by Benedictine Fathers and doing his national exams ('O' Levels) in November. He is very bright and aims to be an engineer.

Michael (8) has joined me in Manyoni, and attends an English medium primary school. He is very interested in Fine Art, and spends a lot of time after school and at weekends drawing cartoons and other pic-

Our youngest, Joyce (4), attends the nursery where her mother works. Like Michael, she is very fond of drawing - and singing.

How do you think Tanzania has been progressing recently, economically, politically and

spiritually?

Tanzania is currently developing very fast. The government has improved in good governance- tax collection, rule of law, accountability of government officials, anti-corruption action, and discipline in using national resources for the benefit of the nation. Economically, we are progressing a new standard gauge rail track from Dar to Mwanza, the Stiegler's Gorge Hydroelectric Dam, improvements in social projects in education, health, and water across the country. GDP annual growth rate advanced 7.1% year on year since 2015

In 2017, 72% of Tanzanians said corruption had decreased "somewhat" or "a lot" over the preceding year, compared with only 13% saying that in 2013! Similarly, 71% said the government is fighting corruption "fairly well" or "very well" in 2017, compared to 37% in 2014.

In Newala, the Diocese grows stronger, celebrating its tenth anniversary in September. Many new churches have been built as has our new Cathedral. We have more priests, and with your help from Bramhall we have served the community in health provision, water supplies, and school porridge.

What do you think the future holds for you and your

family?

I have eleven more years to work before retirement and in that time my post may move anywhere! My future plan is to go back to Newala to live with the community I love so much. I hope to help Newala Diocese which lacks sufficient human resources, and to help my wife run her business. Above all, I hope to educate my children, and fulfil everyone's dream.
